This is a *plein air* workshop with some classroom instruction at Downtown Art Center. All levels are welcome to come paint in the spectacular beauty of tropical Hawai'i.

You will learn to paint expressive, atmospheric, impressionist watercolors, build on your strengths and identify areas for your individual growth with instruction and guidance from Dan Marshall. This *plein air* workshop will focus on composition, design, consistency of wash and proper use of tone to help you elevate your watercolors to fine art paintings! Develop the ability to see shapes and tones, establish a consistent painting process, exploit "mistakes," refine and further develop your technique and take your paintings to the next level. There will be serious work and serious FUN!

In his demo and lecture sessions, Dan will share detailed skills: drawing rhythmically with a loose



accuracy, keeping everything loose to go beyond just coloring in your drawing; Keeping connectivity and color harmony working for you; Using varying consistencies of pigment in relation to the degree of wetness in the paper; Varying types of edges and subtly shifting value and temperature to create visual depth and interest. Sounds like a lot!... but boy is it fun to start truly understanding and exploring the creation process. It's a real privilege to learn from this great master of watercolor.


Tips & Tricks Jimmy Tablante

Outdoor painting is my favorite thing to do and to paint in actual beautiful places. This gives me more challenges and excitement, especially if I'm using water media. In my outdoor experiences, I find that on this journey I need the right and best materials, including having a light pochade easel box, well designed and planned. I did have a "bad" experience with my old French pochade easel box that was big and heavy.

As a designer, I decided to create and design my own mini and handy light easel box. From here I did a lot of planning and designs until I arrived at a simple design that I could easily carry and install and on which I can use 9"x12" or 12"x15" paper, the best size in *plein air* painting. I don't use big size watercolor paper on site--it's impossible to finish my painting in a short amount of time. This is how I started to make my mini easel box and here are some of my designs.













FEATURED ARTIST Laurel Portner

Born and raised in Michigan, Laurel always wanted to try something artistic. In 1994 she moved to Sarasota, Florida where she took classes in acrylic painting. Beginning in the late 1990s, she and her husband began to spend winter months in Hawaii and made a permanent move after 9/11. Both their daughters moved to Hawaii and they had another family island connection as well, Laurel's brother-in-law. Laurel's niece is the artist Maya Portner.

It's Maya who initially pointed Laurel to the Kindred Spirits portrait group that Yoko Radke ran for years, first at Paki Hale, then later at Linekona. Laurel helped Yoko schedule models and eventually took over as coordinator. Laurel began with watercolor in a George Woollard class at UH years ago. She says, "I was hooked. He's such a good teacher. I started playing with watercolor and I stuck with it because we were traveling and it was perfect for that." She studied with Mark Norseth. Patrice Federspiel, and others at Linekona. Now she paints regularly with a local group that meets online. Together they choose a subject and paint
